2677	Special Education Program Type	100	Designated Instruction Services (DIS)	In California, designated instruction and services are also considered to be developmental, corrective, and other supportive services as are required to assist an individual with exceptional needs (also defined as a "child with a disability") to benefit from special education, and are not offered separately from special education unless State standards consider the service as special education.
2678	Special Education Program Type	200	Resource Specialist Program (RSP)	As specified in EC 56362, the Resource Specialist Program shall provide, but not limited to, all of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provision for a resource specialist or specialists who shall provide instruction and services for those pupils whose needs have been identified in an individualized education program developed by the individualized education program team and who are assigned to regular classroom teachers for a majority of a school day. • Provision of information and assistance to individuals with exceptional needs and their parents. • Provision of consultation, resource information, and material regarding individuals with exceptional needs to their parents and to regular staff members. • Coordination of special education services with the regular school programs for each individual with exceptional needs enrolled in the resource specialist program. • Monitoring of pupil progress on a regular basis, participation in the review and revision of individualized education programs, as appropriate, and referral of pupils who do not demonstrate appropriate progress to the individualized education program team. • Emphasis at the secondary school level on academic achievement, career and vocational development, and preparation for adult life.
2679	Special Education Program Type	300	Special Day Class (SDC)	As specified in Title 5 CCR 3053, a Special Day Class (SDC) is a class composed of individuals whose needs, as specified in the Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP), can be appropriately met within the class.
